Now know ye, That there is theretofore granted by the United States unto the said Bill Hilchkanum the track of land above described. To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Bill Hilchkanum and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agriculture, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore there-from, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.
