Dear Mr. Sullivan,

Thank you so much for meeting with me this last Thursday, April 18th, and discussing the likelihood that Arthur Andersen was involved in federal tax fraud with the East Lake Sammamish Trail project, and nationwide with multiple fraudulent appraisals for Burlington Northern Santa Fe.

I wanted you to know that I am in the process of contacting the major television news magazines, 60 Minutes, 20/20, and Dateline, with the hope one of these shows will take an interest in this fraud. If they do, it is inevitable that they will be contacting you for a comment.

I have been able to confirm that Charles Montange was General Council for the Rails to Trails Conservancy, in the past. As we discussed at our meeting, he was the lawyer for The Land Conservancy of Seattle and King County (TLCSKC) and had knowledge that BNSF intended to take the tax write-off at \$41.7 million. This makes a stronger case that the national organization, the Rails to Trails Conservancy, has a connection to this fraud, nationwide.

Again, thank you for looking into this situation.
